The School

St. Bernard of Clairvaux Catholic School

Located in the heart of Little Forest Hills residential community, minutes away from White Rock Lake and the Dallas Arboretum and Botanical Gardens, St. Bernard of Clairvaux Catholic School, known as the "Gem of East Dallas," has served its parish and surrounding communities for the last 75 years by inspiring enduring friendships and cultivating community and a sense of belonging. When asked what makes St. Bernard's special, one school member says, "We are a family where the children and teachers really care for each other."

Established in 1948, St. Bernard of Clairvaux Catholic School opened its doors with 115 students and was staffed by three sisters from the teaching order Sisters of the Holy Spirit and Mary Immaculate located in San Antonio. By 1980, a second-story of classrooms, a cafeteria/auditorium, and residences for the clergy and sisters had been added to St. Bernard's. Additional land was purchased shortly thereafter for parking and facility renovation. Today, the school is home to approximately 150 PK3-8 students and attracts a diverse demographic representing 25 different zip codes from around the DFW metroplex. True to the Cistercian charism of its patron, St. Bernard of Clairvaux, the faculty seeks to form saints and scholars through Catholic spiritual formation, emphasizing academic excellence and service to others. The pastor and parochial vicar of the Institute of the Incarnate Word Order (IVE) serve the parish, and two SSVM Sisters have recently joined the School's talented and dedicated faculty.

At its heart, St. Bernard of Clairvaux Catholic School provides a faith-filled, nurturing environment coupled with a rigorous academic program. The small classroom setting enables teachers to work closely with the students to achieve excellence in faith, academics, service, and character. Each day at SBS, students enter a nurturing and engaging environment where they are genuinely welcomed by all. The call to serve others is instilled in the students, and they have opportunities to take on leadership roles at every grade level. SBS graduates leave with the poise, confidence, knowledge, and determination to succeed in high school and beyond. They also leave knowing that they are loved and will forever be a part of the SBS community.

The Principal's primary responsibility is to oversee and coordinate daily operations of the school, including oversight of Catholic identity, academic excellence, extra-curricular programing, and personnel management. Possessed of strong leadership and interpersonal skills, the Principal is expected to exercise fiscal responsibility, plan strategically for the school's development and growth, and guide effective growth and interaction among parents, students and faculty and staff. The next principal of SBS will find a unified parish and school community. S/he will enter an educational environment that is a diverse, loving community who views itself as family--close-knit, caring, and devoted to the School. Parents and teachers alike describe the School as a "happy place, full of joy, where every student is known by name and feels safe and welcomed." The next Principal will also find supportive parents, dedicated teachers, hard-working volunteers, and a committed and involved pastor and parochial vicar. The presence of Fr. Luis, Fr. Andy, and the SSVM Sisters on staff is especially treasured.



Opportunities & Challenges



Opportunities for the next Principal abound at St. Bernard of Clairvaux. S/he will be able to build on the excellent work accomplished by the current Principal and her staff. Technological tools and resources that best engage the talents and passion of individual students have been brought to the School. For example, project-based learning (PBL) programs and experienced teacher facilitators offer students a variety of ways to engage in hands-on activities. The next Principal's focus will be on growth in enrollment, strength in academic excellence and Catholic identity, and promotion of the School. Yet, the next Principal will face several challenges in leading St. Bernard's into the future, as schools with limited resources often do. As such, the next Principal will be asked to focus on the following priorities for the next three to five years.

Foster a spirit of Catholic identity and fervor to be involved in Church activities.



Provide consistent and effective communication for faculty and family groups.



Collaborate in developing new and existing educational programs for the School.



Establish a sequential and developmentally appropriate student behavior program throughout all grade levels.
